Team "Books and Media"

Mission: To learn about books and media provided by the USF Libraries.

Instructions: Each team member should have their own copy of the USF Tampa Library Directory & Map (blue sheet). Be sure that all team members know how the answers were found, so that they can explain the questions and the answers to students from other teams. **You have 15 minutes to answer the following 5 questions:**

- 1. The <u>**Circulating Collection</u>** (3rd, 4th, and 5th floors) is a collection of books that you can check out. Go to the Circulating Collection and find a book starting with call number LB2343. Write down its title and mark its location on your map.</u>
- 2. The <u>Reference Collection</u> (Basement) is a collection of books that you can use only while you're in the USF Tampa Library (you can't check them out). Go to the Reference Collection and find a book starting with call number Q123. Write down its title and mark its location on your map.
- 3. The <u>Media Resources</u> area (Basement) includes CDs, DVDs, and other media items. Go there and write down the title of a CD or DVD.

After you have answered the first three questions, return to the Library classroom to answer the remaining questions. Start a web browser and go to lib.usf.edu.

- 4. Under <u>Research Tools</u>, you'll find a link to the <u>USF Libraries</u> <u>Catalog</u>, which is an index to all of the books (circulating, reference, and other books) that the USF Libraries make available to you. You can also just start typing in the textbox at the top of the homepage. Locate a <u>physical (not an e-book) copy of the book</u> *I Am a Strange Loop* by Douglas Hofstadter in the USF Tampa Library. Which library collection is this book in and what is the book's call number?
- 5. Use the library collection and call number for *I Am a Strange Loop* to mark its location on your map.
- 6. Many books in the USF Libraries collection are e-books (books that you can read online). Use the Catalog to find the e-book for *How to Do Everything Genealogy*. Click the link for the book and use its Table of Contents to find the title for Part I.
